Other: An excellent redesign of a 22+' Beckmann launch/tugboat hull. Thanks to naval architect Lorne Gardner she now has a sheer profile and a cabin with generous accommodations for two. The Semple engine was built by Bill Gilbert from castings. It is mounted above the propeller shaft for ease of maintenance and uses a 1:1 belt drive. The air pump is of the Bailey, or Navy, type. A set of steering and engine controls is located in the after-cockpit, so the owners may fish or set and pull crab pots with ease.
